



## Rabbit Enrichment Ideas

Rabbits are inquisitive, playful and intelligent animals that really benefit from mental and physical stimulation and enrichment. Below are some ideas of things you can provide at home to keep your bunny busy!

- Tunnels – cat tunnels are great
- Cardboard boxes – rabbits like it when they have 2 doorways cut out for easy entry and exit. Tape several boxes together to make a castle!
- Toilet rolls, tissue boxes or egg cartons filled with hay, shredded paper or yummy treats are inexpensive toy ideas.
  - Wooden pegs clipped to the bars of the cage for flipping up and down
- Forage trays – boxes or plastic trays filled with shredded paper with scattered treats mixed through for foraging
- String or twine tied across like a washing line with green leafy vegetables pegged to it for your bunny to pull down and eat.

  - Dehydrating fruit and vegetables to make tasty snacks
  - Plastic cat balls with bells inside for pushing and throwing around.
    - Plastic baby toys that rattle for throwing.
- Plastic or wooden bird toys that can be clipped to the bars of the cage. Ones with bells are lots of fun but make sure they don't chew them. \*Please no rope toys\*
- Small dog or cat plastic treat balls – treats can be put inside and when rolled around the treats fall out a small hole in the ball.
- Seagrass door mats are great for chewing up! Several mats together can be made into tunnels or different shapes.
  - Fruit tree branches (i.e. apple, pear) and leaves are great for munching on!
